WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Participation in the Oklahoma GEAR UP Parent Leadership Academy is open to all parents, grandparents and guardians who have or have had children in any of the 10 GEAR UP schools/sites in the Oklahoma GEAR UP grant **and who is not a current employee or their spouse of the school or school district.**

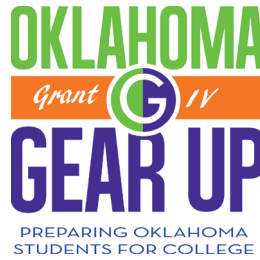
PARTICIPANTS WILL:

- Enhance their leadership and communication skills.
- Learn about the public education system in Oklahoma.
- Receive and learn how to read and understand the test data from their school and district.
- Learn about achievement gaps in their school.
- Partner with their school administrators, teachers, and other parents to improve student achievement.
- Connect to an existing network of committed parents and community leaders.
- **Commit to attend all three sessions (three days total).**
- **Commit to leading at least one project in a school or community.**
- Receive support and coaching from GEAR UP and school staff as projects are planned and implemented.
- Maintain an ongoing connection with Oklahoma GEAR UP.

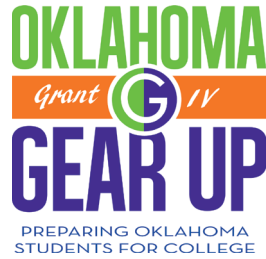
STIPEND

- Participants will be awarded a stipend of \$200 per day for each PLA Training (*two days in January and one day in February*).

FUNDING

- Each PLA Team may receive an initial \$3000 from OK GEAR UP to implement a PLA project. Teams may seek \$1500 from the community in support of their project.
- If community monies are guaranteed, GEAR UP will match these funds up to \$1500.

The U.S. Department of Education awarded Oklahoma with a state GEAR UP grant totaling \$20.5 million in 1999. The grant was supplemented with a one-year extension of \$4.4 million in 2004. Oklahoma received additional GEAR UP grants totaling \$20.6 million in 2005 and \$34.9 million in 2011. In 2017, Oklahoma was awarded a fourth, consecutive GEAR UP grant in the amount of \$24.5 million over the next seven years. Oklahoma's GEAR UP program will ultimately receive approximately \$104.9 million in federal funds by 2024.

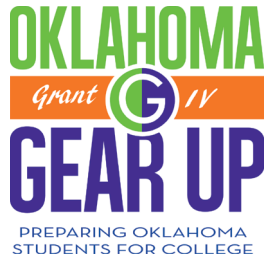

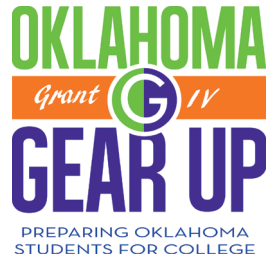

Parent Leadership Academy **FACT SHEET**

What is the Oklahoma GEAR UP Parent Leadership Academy?

The Oklahoma GEAR UP Parent Leadership Academy (PLA) helps Oklahoma parents become more involved in improving public schools to enhance academic achievement for all students.

What are the mission and goals of the Oklahoma GEAR UP Parent Leadership Academy?

Mission: To develop a network of skilled confident parents who will partner with local school sites to significantly increase the number of students who are prepared to enter and succeed in post-secondary education.

Goals: Graduates of the PLA will be able to: (1) provide leadership in parent-school-community partnerships that enhance student achievement in preparation for entrance and success in postsecondary education, (2) design and implement school-wide or district-wide processes that promote a high-performance learning culture, and (3) encourage historically under-involved parents to engage in a strong community-school partnership.

How many parents will participate?

The Academy will train approximately 60 parents in 2020 throughout Oklahoma. These parents will engage other parents through projects and activities in their local schools and communities.

Who will participate?

The Academy will accept nominations from the 10 school districts/sites participating in the Oklahoma GEAR UP grant. Participants must have an interest in the improvement of Oklahoma student achievement.

What will participants in the Academy be trained to do?

Participants will be trained in leadership and communications skills, given information, including achievement data, and provided an explanation of Oklahoma’s public education system. Training will enable them to work more effectively with other parents in their communities to improve local schools and increase student achievement by designing and completing a project in their school or district.

Where will the institute sessions be held?

The sessions will be held at designated regional locations.

How much do the sessions cost?

The Academy is free to all participants; all expenses including meals, and materials will be provided.

BENEFITS OF PARENT LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR PARENTS:

- Parents will be better informed about education, in general.
- Parents will have clearer understanding of education terms/jargon which facilitates more effective conversations between parents, teachers and students.
- Parents will have clearer understanding of what children are expected to learn and be able to do.
- Parents will place higher value on education for their child and for themselves.
- Parents will help schools better communicate with all parents.

BENEFITS OF PARENT LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR SCHOOLS:

- Schools will have parents who are better informed about the challenges schools face.
- Schools will have parents who are more supportive of schools and school staff.
- Schools will have parents who are better prepared to serve as effective members of school committees, councils, etc.
- Schools will have parents who understand the need to be involved in their child's education.
- Schools will have parents who can bring skills and resources to schools.

BENEFITS OF PARENT LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR STUDENTS:

- Students will have parents who better understand the child's strengths and challenges at school.
- Students will know their parents are interested in their education.
- Students will know their parents value education.
- Students will have parents who are stronger advocates, decision-makers and teachers.
- Students will have greater likelihood of achieving at higher levels and of continuing education after high school.
