



The U.S. Department of Education awarded Oklahoma with a state GEAR UP grant totaling \$20.5 million in 1999. The grant was supplemented with a one-year extension of \$4.4 million in 2004. Oklahoma received additional GEAR UP grants totaling \$20.6 million in 2005 and \$34.9 million in 2011. In September 2017, the State Regents were awarded a fourth, consecutive GEAR UP grant in the amount of \$24 million over the next seven years.

WHY GO TO COLLEGE? Set *"Future you"* up for success

MORE OPPORTUNITIES

A college degree will expand your job possibilities and increase your likelihood of employment.

- In the next 10 years, 70% of jobs in Oklahoma will require some kind of education or training beyond a high school diploma.
- Nearly 90% of Oklahoma residents who earn an undergraduate degree are employed in the state a year after graduating.

JOB SECURITY

A college degree in your field will protect you and your job during upcoming technology advancement.

- By 2025, 30% of work activities in Oklahoma could be automated.
- Jobs in fields such as sales, office administration, and transportation have a high potential of being replaced by artificial intelligence.

INCREASED EARNINGS

A college degree can make a huge impact on your earnings and quality of life.

- The average yearly salary of a high school graduate is just under \$32,000 (\$3,000 lower than the average cost of living in Oklahoma, at \$35,000).
- Associate's and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income 25% and 75% higher, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.

JOB SATISFACTION

A college degree is the first building block to qualify you for the career and life you're striving for.

- The average person spends about one third of their life at work, so doing what you love is vital.
- College graduates are also more likely to receive better retirement matching benefits, health savings accounts, tuition reimbursement, free childcare, and travel reimbursement from their jobs.

East Central University is an academic-driven university. Be sure to study hard and pay close attention to your ACT test and scores.





Before you step onto campus for your first semester, take part in Lion Camp. Lion Camp helps prepare you for college to make the transition from high school to college a positive experience.





Fill out your FAFSA early, apply to the college early, apply for scholarships early and keep in mind that NEO gives a free dorm room to Oklahoma's Promise students.



Students should always be aware of important administrative dates, especially for drop and withdraw dates in addition to enrollment deadlines.





Know when scholarship deadlines are so that you can prioritize which ones to fill out first.



Incoming freshmen should apply before February 1 to be considered for scholarships.


