It can ensure that all students have the opportunity to receive hands-on assistance as they take the first big step toward continuing their education.


MEDIA OUTREACH



Send students out to businesses in the community to share information about the positive impact GEAR UP has on their lives. Ask them to hang the enclosed poster to show their support.


DREAM WALL

MORE OPPORTUNITIES

A college degree will expand your job possibilities and increase your likelihood of employment.

- In the next 10 years, 70% of jobs in Oklahoma will require some kind of education or training beyond a high school diploma.
- Nearly 90% of Oklahoma residents who earn an undergraduate degree are employed in the state a year after graduating.

JOB SECURITY

A college degree in your field will protect you and your job during upcoming technology advancement.

- By 2025, 30% of work activities in Oklahoma could be automated.
- Jobs in fields such as sales, office administration, and transportation have a high potential of being replaced by artificial intelligence.

INCREASED EARNINGS

A college degree can make a huge impact on your earnings and quality of life.

- The average yearly salary of a high school graduate is just under \$32,000 (\$3,000 lower than the
 average cost of living in 0klahoma, at \$35,000).
- Associate's and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income 25% and 75% higher, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.

A college degree is the first building block to qualify you for the career and life you're striving for.

- The average person spends about one third of their life at work, so doing what you love is vital.
- College graduates are also more likely to receive better retirement matching benefits, health savings accounts, tuition reimbursement, free childcare, and travel reimbursement from their jobs.
