

POST-SECONDARY PREPARATION + OK PROMISE DEADLINES

ACADEMIC PREPARATION

- Maintain strong grades Aim for a GPA that keeps you competitive for college admission and scholarship eligibility (including OK Promise).
- ☐ Take challenging courses Enroll in advanced, honors, AP, or concurrent enrollment classes if available.
- Review graduation requirements to ensure you're on track for high school completion.
- Meet OK Promise curriculum Ensure you're completing the 17-unit coursework required by the OK Promise program.

TEXOKLAHOMA'S PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

- ☐ Confirm enrollment in OK Promise Deadline to apply is Dec. 31 of your 12th-grade year.
- If not yet enrolled, visit www.okpromise.org and complete the application.
- Submit required documents (tax forms, birth certificate, etc.).
- Review OK Promise Requirements: Maintain a 2.5 GPA in core curriculum and overall, avoid criminal/delinquent behavior, and stay informed about income requirements for continued eligibility.
- ☐ Track OK Promise coursework completion Check which required courses are done and what still needs to be taken in 12th grade.

- ☐ Take the PSAT/NMSQT (October) May qualify for National Merit Scholarships.
- Explore career interests Use tools like OKcollegestart.org or OKCareerGuide.org.
- Research colleges, universities, and tech programs Consider cost, size, location, programs offered, and OK Promise eligibility.
- Attend college fairs and campus tours many schools offer preview days or virtual tours.

STANDARDIZED TESTING

- Register for ACT and/or SAT GEAR UP pays for the Fall test and State pays for Spring test take it seriously because it determines lots of scholarship eligibility and awards.
- If you want to take the ACT again, utilize free waivers if eligible for free/reduced lunch or OK Promise.
- Consider taking test prep or ACT bootcamps.
